## HOME AND SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP



**'It's Nice to be Nice'**

I am sure you will be pleased to know that, in the best interests of the children, St.Peter's RC School has a Home and School Partnership agreement, as set out below:

**Children will:**

1. Come to school every day on time
2. Wear the correct uniform
3. Do my best in classwork and homework
4. Be polite, kind and helpful
5. Show respect for myself and others

**Parents/Carers/Guardians will:**

1. See that my child(ren) attend school regularly and on time
2. See that my child(ren) dress correctly and follow the school's dress code
3. Inform the school on the first day of absence
4. Support my children with homework
5. Support the code of conduct and other school policies
6. Attend Parent's Meetings and get to know about the school
7. Keep the school informed of any relevant information that may affect my child's learning, behaviour or attendance

8. **Physical Chastisement:**

As a parent/guardian I understand that I am responsible for disciplining my children or those under my care when they are not in school. I fully understand and am aware that the use of physical force in disciplining them may be illegal in certain circumstances. This may include where an implement has been used or where the use of that force has resulted in injury and the use of prolonged physical stress positions. (This is where children are placed in a position of discomfort for a long period of time). I understand in these circumstances the school has a statutory duty to report such incidents to Children's Social Care and that the police may be asked to investigate.

**The School will:**

1. Care for your child's safety, happiness and well being
2. See that your child achieves their best and develops a sense of responsibility
3. Provide a broad and balanced curriculum that meets the needs of your child
4. Promote the 'Every Child Matters' agenda to develop lifelong learning skill
5. Keep you informed about your child's progress and general school matters
6. Ensure a warm welcome and listening ear
